ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows-PART I - ESTABLISHMENT OF THE NIGERIA ARABIC LANGUAGE VILLAGE 1.-(1) There is established a village to be known as the Nigeria Establishment of the Nigeria Arabic Arabic Language Village (in this Act. referred to as "the Village"). 10	(k) erect, provide, equip and maintain libraries, laboratories, lecture
11	halls, halls of residence, refectories, sports ground, playing fields and other
12	building or things necessary or suitable or convenient for the objectives of the
13	Village;

22	approved by the Federal Government, on deposit or current account;

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note does not form part of the above Act but is intended to explain its purpose)

This Act seeks to establish the Nigeria Arabic Language Village in order to promote the study and use of the Arabic Language in Nigeria by exploring all relevant and available avenues, potentials and resources.
