AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE CHANGE OF NAME OF THE FEDERAL CHARACTER COMMISSION AND THE RE-DESIGNATION AND RE-ENACTMENT OF THE FEDERAL CHARACTER COMMISSION ACT AS THE EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES ACT AND FOR OTHER RELATED MATTERS

EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES ACT AND FOR OTHER RELATED MATTERS Sponsored by Senator 'Biodun Christine Olujimi [ Commencement BE IT ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows: PART 1 - CHANGE OF NAME AND RE-DESIGNATION OF THE FEDERAL CHARACTER COMMISSION ETC. 1.-(1) The Federal Character Commission (in this bill referred to as Change of name and re-designation of the Federal "the Commission" established by the Federal Character Commission Act 4 Character Commission shall as from the commencement of this Act, be known and referred to as the Equal Opportunity Commission. 6 (2) Accordingly, the Federal Character Commission Act shall be redesignated as the Equal Opportunity Commission Act. 8 (3) The change of name of the Commission and the re-designation of the enactment specified in subsections (1) and (2) of this section shall not 10 affect anything done or purported to be done under or pursuant to the said 11 12 enactment. PART II – RE-ESTABLISHMENT OF AND THE EQUAL GOVERNING 13 OPPORTUNITY COMMISSION BOARD, ETC. 14 2.-(1) There shall continue to be established a body to be known as Re-establishment 15 of the Figural Opportunity: the Equal Opportunity Commission (in this Act referred to as "the 16 Commission and governing heard Commission"). 17 (2) The Commission: 18 (a) shall be a body corporate with perpetual succession; 19

11	principles of proportional sharing of all bureaucratic economic, media and
12	political posts at all levels of government between the states of the

15	(c) to take such legal measures including the prosecution of the
16	heads or staff of any Ministry, Extra-Ministerial Department or agency
17	which fails to comply with any federal character principle or formula
18	prescribed or adopted by the Commission;
19	(d) To work out:
20	(i) An equitable formula, subject to the approval of the President
21	for distribution of socio-economic services, amenities and infrastructura
22	facilities;
23	(ii) Modalities and schemes for redressing the problems o
24	imbalances and reducing the fear of relative deprivation and
25	marginalization in the Nigerian system of federalism and other interes
26	groups such as women, religions, people with disabilities and those living
27	with HIV/AIDS as it obtains in the public and private sectors.
28	(e) to intervene in the operation of any agency of the Federa

Government, where in the opining of the Commission the function of the

agency concerned is relevant to the functions of the Commission and the

1	Commission is of the opinion that it is not being effectively implemented;
2	(f) to advise the Federal, State, and local governments to intervene
3	and influence providers of services, goods and socio-economic amenities to
4	extend such services, goods and socio-economic amenities to deprived areas of
5	the country;
6	(g) to ensure that all Ministries and Extra-Ministerial Departments,
7	agencies and other bodies affected by this Act have a clear criteria indicating
8	conditions to be fulfilled and comprehensive guidelines on the procedure for:
9	(i) Determining eligibility and the procedure for employment in the
10	public and private sectors of the economy;
11	(ii) The provision of social services, goods and socio-economic
12	amenities in Nigeria.
13	(h) To ensure that public officers shall, in the performance of their
14	functions, adhere strictly to rules and regulations made pursuant to this Act:
ì 5	(i) to advise the Federal Government of Nigeria on the structure and
16	rationalization of any Ministry, Extra-Ministerial Department or agency; and
17	(j) Carry out such other functions as the President shall, from time to
18	time assign to it.
19	(2) For the avoidance of doubt:
20	(a) the posts mentioned in paragraphs (a) and (b) of subsection (1) of
21	this section shall include those of the Permanent Secretary in the Civil Service
22	of the Federation or the State Civil Service, Directors-General in Extra-
23	Ministerial Departments and parastatals, Directors in Ministries and Extra-
24	Ministerial Departments, Senior Military Officers, Senior Diplomatic Posts,
25	Managerial Cadres in the Federal and State Parastatals, bodies corporate,
26	Agencies and Institution; and
27	(b) socio-economic services, amenities and facilities mentioned in
28	paragraph (d) of subsection (1) of this section include those in the sectors of
29	education, electricity, health, commerce and industry, telecommunications,
30	transport and your development.

8	with HIV/AIDS in the appointments of its directors and senior management
9	staff.
10	6(1)The Commission shall have power to:
11	(a) Formulate and provide guidelines for Government agencies
12	and other employers and providers of services and socio-economic
13	amenities;
14	(b) Monitor compliance with the guidelines, and formulae at
15	Federal, State, local governments and zonal levels in the employment and
16	provision of socio-economic amenities;
17	(c) Enforce compliance with its guidelines and formulae in areas of
18	the provision of employment opportunities, distribution of infrastructural
19	facilities, socio-economic amenities and other indices
20	(d) Compel boards of directors of Government-owned companies
21	and other enterprises, which are subject to the provision of this Act, to
22	comply with the guidelines and formulae on ownership structure,
23	employment and distribution of their products;
24	(e) Demand and receive returns on employment and socio-
25	economic indices from any enterprise or body corporate and penalize any
26	enterprise which does not comply with a request from the Commission.
27	(f) Undertake the recruitment and training of staff of government
28	agencies or departments where desirable;
29	(g) institute investigation into any matter relating to any institution

or organization which is subject to the provisions of this Act and if the

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institution or organization concerned fails to cooperate with the Commission, the institution or organization shall be required to bear the cost of such investigation; and (h) Do anything which in the opinion of the Commission is incidental to its functions under this Act. (2) For the purposes of subsection (1) of this section, the Commission 6 shall have power to take such legal action including the prosecution of any person, whether corporate or unincorporated who, being obliged to comply 9 with the provisions of this Act, fails to do so. 7.-(1) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in any law, a person 10 who holds office as a member of the Commission under this Act shall not be 11 qualified for any elective office or for election as a member of any legislative 13 body. (2) Noting shall preclude a member of the Commission from 14 resigning his appointment as a member of the Commission at any time for the 15 purposes of contesting for any elective office. 8. -(1) The Commission shall meet for the conduct of its business at 17 such times, places and on such days as the chairman may appoint. 18 19 (2) The chairman shall preside at all meetings of the Commission but if he is absent from any meeting of the Commission the members present shall elect one of their number to preside at that meeting. 21 22 (3) During the chairman's absence on leave or if the chairman is otherwise not available or is unable to perform his functions, the president may 23 appoint any member of the Commission to act as chairman for any specified 24 25 period. 26 (4) The quorum for a meeting of the Commission shall be not less than one third of the total number of members of the Commission at the date of the 27 meeting. 28 (5) Questing put before the Commission at a meeting shall be decided

by consensus and, where this is not possible, by a majority of the votes of the

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1	members present and voting.	
2	(6) The chairman shall in the case of an equality of votes have a	
3	casting vote in addition to his deliberative vote.	
4	(7) Subject to this section, the Commission shall have power to	
5	regulate its proceedings and may make standing orders with respect to the	
6	holding of meetings, the notice to be given, the procedure thereat, the	
7	keeping of minutes of such proceedings and the custody and production for	
8	inspection of such minutes.	
9	(8) The validity of any proceedings of the Commission shall not be	
10	affected by any vacancy in its membership or any defect in the appointment	
11	of a member or by reason that a person not entitled to do so took part in the	
12	proceedings.	
13	PART III - STAFF OF THE COMMISSION	
14	9(1) There shall be a secretary to the Commission who shall:	Secretary to the Commission a
15	(a) Have such qualifications and experience as are appropriate for a	other staff
16	person required to perform the function of his office under this Act; and	
17	(b) Be appointed by the President.	
18	(2) Subject to the general direction of the chairman, the secretary	
19	shall:	
20	(a) Be responsible' for keeping proper records of the proceedings	
21	of the Commission; and	
22	(b) Be the head of the Commission's secretariat and be responsible	•
23	for the administration thereof and the direction and control of all other	
24	employees of the Commission with the approval of the chairman.	
25	(3) The chairman shall have power to appoint either directly or on	
26	secondment from any public service in the Federation, such number of	
27	employees as my, in the opinion of the chairman, be required to assist the	
28	Commission in the discharge of any of its functions under this Act, and shall	
29	have power to pay persons so employed such remuneration (including	

allowances) as the chairman may, after consultation with the Federal

3	chairman from appointing persons from outside the public service of the

7	temporary basis for an honorarium shall have the same rights and obligation as
8	the members of the public service defined by section 24 of the Pension Act.
9	PART IV - FINANCIAL PROVISIONS

11 -	fund into which shall be paid and credited:
12	(a) the annual subvention received from the Federal Government;
13	(b) such money as may, from time to time, be lent, deposited with or
14	granted to the Commission by the Government;
15	(c) all fees and charges for services rendered by the Commission; and
16	(d) all other sums which may, from time to time accrue to the
17	Commission.
18	(2) The Commission may, from time to time, apply the funds at its
19	disposal:
20	(a) to the cost of the administration of the Commission and for the
21	purposes of any research being undertaken by the Commission;
22	(b) to the payment of fees, allowances and expenses of members of
23	the Commission or of any committee set up by the Commission;
24	(c) to the payment of the salaries, allowances and benefits of officers
25	and servants of the Commission:
26	(d) for the maintenance of any property vested in the Commission or
27	under its administration; and
28	(e) For and in connection with all or any of the functions of the
29	Commission under this Act or any other written law.

l	11(1) The Commission may accept gifts of land, money or other	Power to accept

## EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

The bill changes the name of the name of the Federal Character Commission, re-designates the Federal Character Commission Act and re-enacts a new Act which among other things provides for the re-establishment of the Equal Opportunity Commission which shall be responsible for the enforcement of the Federal Character principle and shall also be responsible for the protection of the rights and interest of all such other groups such as women, religions, people with disabilities and those living with HIV/AIDS.
