ACT TO REPEAL THE FEDERAL COLLEGES OF EDUCATION ACT 1986 AND TO RE-ENACT FEDERAL COLLEGES OF EDUCATION AND OTHER RELATED **MATTERS**

Sponsored by Senator Barau I. Jibrin Commencement BE IT ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows: PART I - PART IB - ESTABLISHMENT OF FEDERAL COLLEGES OF EDUCATION 1.-(I) There are hereby established the Federal Colleges of Establishment of Federal Colleges Education specified in Schedule 1 to this Act (hereafter in this Act of Education collectively referred to as "Colleges") which shall have such powers and 5 exercise such functions as are conferred on them by this Act. 6 Each College shall be a body corporate with perpetual Legal Status of 7 the Colleges succession and a common seal and shall have power to acquire and dispose 8 of interests in movable and immovable property and may sue and be sued in 9 its corporate name. 10 2.-(1) The governance of each College and the direction of its Governing 11 Council of affairs shall vest in the Governing Council of the College concerned Colleges 12 (hereafter in this Act referred to as "the Council"). 13 (2) Without prejudice to the generality of subsection (1) of this 14 section, it shall be the responsibility of the Council to consider and approve: 15 (a) the plan of activities of the College; 16 (b) the programme of studies, courses and research to be 17 undertaken by the College; 18 (c) the annual estimates of the College, and 19 (d) the investment plans of the College. 20

- 4.-(1)The Council shall meet for the conduct of business at such times, places and on such days as the Chairman may appoint but shall meet not less than once in every three months.
- (2) The Chairman may at any time and shall, at the request in writing of not less than 6 members, convene a meeting of the Council.
- (3) At any meeting of the Council the Chairman shall preside; but in his absence, members present shall elect one of their members to preside at the meeting.
- (4) Where the Council desires to obtain the advice of any person on any particular matter, the Council may co-opt persons who are not members of the Council but persons co-opted shall not be entitled to vote at a meeting of the Council.
- 13 (5) The quorum of the Council shall be one half of the total members 14 of the Council at least one of whom shall be a member appointed by the 15 President, Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces.

- 5.-(1) The fixing of the seal of the College shall be authenticated by the signature of the Chairman, Provost and some other members of the Council authorized generally or specially by the Council to act for that purpose.
- (2)Any contract or instrument which, if made or executed by a person other than a body corporate would not be required to be under seal may be made and executed on behalf of the College by any person generally or specially authorized to act for that purpose by the Council.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note does not form part of the above Act, but is intended to explain its purport)

This Bill seeks to establish the Federal Colleges of Education listed in Schedule 1 to the Act. The functions of each College, amongst other things are:

- (a) To provide full-time courses of teaching, instruction and training in technology, applied sciences, commerce, arts, social sciences, humanities, Law and management;
- (b) Carry out research in the development and adaptation of techniques as the Council may, from time to time, determine.

The Act also provides for the appointment of a Provost to be the Chief executive of each College, Principal Officers and other members of staff.

Other provisions relate to the discipline of students, finances, pensions of staff and supplementary matters: schedule 1 to the Act contains list of all the Federal Colleges of Education covered by the Act, while Schedule 2 thereof prescribes the terms of service of members of each Council and proceedings thereof.
