AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE FEDERAL SCHOLARSHIP COMMISSION TO APPROVE AND DISBURSE SCHOLARSHIP BURSARY AND GRANTS FOR EDUCATIONAL AND RESEARCH PURPOSES, AND FOR OTHER MATTERS CONNECTED THEREWITH

AND FOR OTHER MATTERS CONNECTED THEREWITH Sponsored by Senator T. Y. Kaura Commencement BE IT ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows: PART 1- ESTABLISHMENT AND COMPOSITION, ETC. OF THE FEDERAL SCHOLARSHIP COMMISSION 1.-(1) There is hereby established a body to be known as the Establishment of \* the Board 4 "Federal Scholarship Commission" (in this Act referred to as "the Commission"). 6 (2) The Commission: (a) Shall be a body corporate with perpetual succession and a 8 common seal; and 9 (b) May sue and be sued in its corporate name; 10 (c) May acquire, hold and manage any moveable or immovable 11 property for the purpose of carrying its functions. (3) The headquarters of the Commission shall be situated in the 13 Federal Capital Territory Abuja and there shall be established six zonal 14 offices in the six Geopolitical zone of the Federation. 15 2.-(1) There is established for the Commission a Governing Board Establishment and composition 16 (in this Act referred to as "the Board") which shall provide policy guidelines of the Governing Board 17 for the day-to-day administration of the Agency. 18 (2) The Board shall comprise: 19 (a) a part-time chairman to be appointed by the President subject to 20 confirmation by the Senate;

11	Board shall meet whenever it is summoned by the Chairman or, if the Chairman
12	is required to do so by notice given to him by not less than 10 members, he shall
13.	summon a meeting of the Board to be held within 14 days from the date which
14	the notice is given.
15	(2) At any meeting of the Board, the Chairman shall preside, but if he
16	is absent, the members present at the meeting shall appoint one of them to
17	preside at the meeting.
18	(3) When the Board desires to obtain the advice of any person on a
19	particular matter, the Board may co-opt him as a member for such period as it
20	thinks fit, "but a person who is a member by virtue of this sub-paragraph shall
21	not be entitled to vote at any meeting of the Board and shall not count towards
22	the quorum.

25	its behalf such of its functions as the Board may determine.
26	(2) A committee appointed under this paragraph shall consist of such
27	number of persons (not necessarily members of the Board) as may be
28	determined by the Board and a person other than a member of the Board shall
29	hold office on the committee in accordance with the terms of his appointment.
30	(3) A decision of a committee of the Board shall be of no effect until it

- (4) The validity of any proceeding of the Board or of a committee shall not be adversely affected by any vacancy in the membership of the Board or a committee or by any defect in the appointment of any member of the Board or a committee or by a reason only that a person not entitle to do so took part in the proceedings.
- (5) A member of the Board or any person holding office on a committee of the Board who has a personal interest in any contract or arrangement entered into or proposed to be considered by the Board or a committee shall forthwith disclose his interest to the Board or committee and shall not vote on any question relating to the contract or arrangement.

## EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

This Bill seeks to provide for the establishment of the Federal Scholarship Commission to approve and disburse scholarship bursary and grants for educational and research purposes.
