1	PART 1 - THE ESTABLISHMENT OF NATIONAL ANTI-KIDNAPPING,

3	1(1) There is hereby established a body to be known as the	Establishment of National Ant-

	17	or actions that assist in the act of kidnapping or terrorism;
	18	(c) the agency may at it discretion pay reward to any person, not being
	19	a person employed by the Agency, in respect of any information or service
	20	rendered to the Agency which may be of assistance to the Agency in the
	21	performance of its duties under this Act (No. 15 of 1992).
Appointment of Secretary and	22	7(1) There shall be established for the Agency a secretariat which
other staff of the Commission	23	shall be headed by the Secretary who shall be appointed by the President.
