AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE FEDERAL COLLEGE OF FORESTRY MAIDUGURI, BORNO STATE AND FOR RELATED MATTERS, 2020

Commencement ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows: PART I - ESTABLISHMENT, OBJECTIVES, FUNCTIONS AND POWERS 1 2 OF THE COLLEGE 3 1.
