Olufemi Fakeye Commencement ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows: 1.-(1) There is hereby upgraded and established as a Federal 1 Establishment of the Federal Medical Centre, the General Hospital Ila-Orangun (in this Act referred to as 2 Medical Centre Ila, Ila-Orangun "the Federal Medical Centre") and the Medical Centre shall serve as the 3 Federal Medical Centre, subject to the provisions of this Bill. 4 (2) The Federal Medical Centre: 5 6 (a) shall be a body corporate; 7 (b) shall sue and be sued in its corporate name; (c) shall have perpetual succession and a common seal. 8 2.
