## **FOR**

AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE NATIONAL BLOOD SERVICE COMMISSION TO COORDINATE, REGULATE AND ENSURE THE PROVISION OF QUALITY BLOOD AND BLOOD PRODUCTS AND FOR RELATED MATTERS

Sponsored by Hon. Abass Tajudeen Commencement ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows: PART 1 - ESTABLISHMENT OF THE NATIONAL BLOOD SERVICE 1 2 COMMISSION 3 1.-(1) There is established a body to be known as the National Establishment of the National 4 Blood Service Commission (in this Act referred to as "the Commission"). Blood Service Commission 5 (2) The Commission shall be a body corporate with perpetual succession and a common seal, may sue and be sued in its corporate name 6 7 and acquire, hold and dispose of any property for the purpose of carrying out 8 its functions under this Act. 9 (3) The Commission shall have its National Headquarters located 10 at the Federal Capital Territory, Abuja with Zonal offices in each of the geo-11 political zones. 12 2. The Commission shall-Objectives of the Commission (a) co-ordinate and control blood transfusion services on a country 13 wide basis within the national health plan; 14 15 (b) ensure the delivery of blood, blood components and blood derivatives which are safe for transfusion and other medical therapies; 16 (c) be the sale regulatory authority for all blood related services 17 18 nationwide; and 19 (d) accredit blood transfusion service facilities throughout the 20 country.

Establishment and Composition of the Governing Board of the Commission

3(1) There is established for the Commission a Governing Board (in
this Act referred to as "the Board") which shall provide the general policy
guidelines for the Commission.

(a) a Chairman who shall be a qualified Health Professional of proven
integrity with a minimum of 20 years' post qualification experience;
(b) the Director of Hospital services of the. Federal Ministry
responsible for Health;
(c) a representative of the Nigerian Society of Hematology and Blood
Transfusion;
(d) a representative of the Association of Medical Laboratory
Scientists of Nigeria:
(e) a representative of (the Armed Forces of Nigeria;
(f) a representative of the National Agency for Food, Drug
Administration and Control (NAFDAC);
(g) a representative of the Nigerian Red Cross Society;
(h) a representative of non-governmental organizations involved in
blood safety; and
(i) the Director-General of the Commission who shall serve as the
Secretary to the Board.
(3) The Chairman and members of the Board, other than those whose
membership is by virtue of their offices, shall be appointed by the President on
the recommendation of the Minister.
(4) The Chairman and other members of the Board shall be persons
who by reason of their professional or business attainments are in the opinion
of the Minister capable of making useful contributions to the work of the
Commission.
(5) The members of the Board, other than the Director-General shall
serve on part-time basis.

17	Proceedings of the Board	
18	1. Subject to this Act and section 27 of the Interpretation Act	
19	(which provides for decisions of a statutory body to be taken by a majority of	
20	its members and for the Chairman to have a second or casting vote), the	
21	Board may make standing orders regulating the proceedings of the Board	
22	and any Committee thereof.	
23	2. The Board shall meet not less than four times in each year and,
