Commencement ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria-PART 1 - ESTABLISHMENT OF THE SOLID MINERALS DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION AND THE GOVERNING BOARD 3 1.-(1) There is hereby established a Commission to be known as the Establishment of the Solid Minerals 4 Solid Minerals Development Commission (in this Bill referred to as "the Development Commission 5 Commission"). EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

This Bill seeks to establish the Solid Minerals Development Commission in the Federal Republic of Nigeria to be charged with the responsibility of managing and administering for effectiveness, the sums received from the allocation of the Federation account for tackling environmental problem which arise from the Mining Excavation, Extraction of Minerals in the Solid Minerals Producing areas.
