BE IT ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows-

1. The Nigerian Communications Commission Act, Cap. N97,
 Laws of the Federation of Nigeria, 2004 (herein referred to as the "Principal
 Act") is amended as set out in this Bill.

"17.-(1) The Funds of the Commission shall consist of-

(a) such funds as budgetary allocations, trust funds, subventions,
grants-in-aid and loans as may, from time to time, be made by the Federal

(b) such sums or property which may, from time to time by way of
loans or grants and gifts accrue to the Commission from any other
Government, non-governmental bodies or individuals; and

(c) other monies received by the Commission which may in any
way, become payable to or vested in the Commission by way of revenues,
fees, levies, taxes, penalties, gifts, grants-in-aid, testamentary disposition
and all other assets that may from time to time accrue to the Commission.
