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

ANACT TO REPEAL THE NIGERIAN AIRSPACE MANAGEMENT AGENCY ACT, CAP N90, LAWS OF THE FEDERATION OF NIGERIA, 2010 AND TO ENACT THE NIGERIAN AIRSPACE MANAGEMENT AGENCY ACT FOR THE PURPOSES OF PROVIDING EFFECTIVE AIR NAVIGATION SERVICES IN NIGERIA, ENSURING SAFETY AND REGULARITY OF AIR NAVIGATION IN NIGERIA AND TO ANY OTHER PLACE WHICH NIGERIA HAS RESPONSIBILITY OF PROVIDING AIR NAVIGATION SERVICES AND FOR RELATED MATTERS

Commencement

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

Cap N90, Laws of the Federation of Nigeria, 2010 and to enact the Nigerian Airspace Management Agency Act for the purposes of providing effective air navigation services, ensuring safety and regularity of air navigation in Nigeria and to any other place which Nigeria has responsibility of providing air navigation services. ad other related matters.
