

2	SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS RELATING TO THE BOARD, ETC.

	EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM	
	This Bill seeks to establish National Commission on Small Arms and Light	
	Weapons charged with the responsibility to among other things regulate and	

prohibit proliferation of small arms, ammunitions and light weapons and sensitize the public on the dangers of small arms and light weapons in order

to discourage their production.
