AN ACT TO PREVENT THE USE OF THE INTERNET TO DISTRIBUTE PORNOGRAPHIC MATERIAL INVOLVING CHILDREN AND FOR RELATED MATTERS

Commencement ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows 1. The oriective of the Bill is to prevent the use of the internet to Objective of the 1 Bill promote, display, describe or facilitate participation in unlawful sexual 2 activities involving young persons. 3 2. No person must offer the Services of, or operate as an internet License to operate 4 service provider unless the person has been granted a license to operate as an 5 internet service provider in accordance with the provisions of this Bill. 6 3. The Commission may grant a license to operate as an internet Granting a 7 License service provider to any applicant who meets the prescribed requirements 8 and who has submitted to the Commission: 9 (a) an application in the prescribed form and manner; and 10 (b) a written undertaking to report the prescribed information in 11 accordance with the regulations. 12 4. The Commission may cancel a license granted under Section 4, License 13 withdrawal if the licensee or, where the licensee is a corporation, a director or officer of 14 the corporation is convicted of any designated offence involving a child. 15 5.-(1) Not internet service provider must knowingly permit the use Prohibition 16 Service 17 its service: (a) For placing child pornography on the internet; 18 (b) By any reason who the provider knows under the law within the 19 previous five years, or 20

	9	authority towards the victim was in a relationship of dependency or where the
	10	victim was under the age of 14 years at the time of the Commission of the
	11	offence;
•	12	"Minister" means the Political Head of the Ministry in charge of
	13	Communications Technology;
	14	"Internet Service Provider" means a person who provides a service that
	15	facilitates access to the internet, whether or not the service is provided free or
	16	for a charge;
	17	"Prescribed: means prescribed by regulation;
	18	"Subscriber" means a person who contracts with or uses the service of an
213	19	internet service provider to obtain access to the internet.
