## FOR

AN ACT TO AMEND THE NATIONAL DIRECTORATE OF EMPLOYMENT ACT (CAP N28 LAWS OF THE FEDERATION 2010), TO ESTABLISH THE NATIONAL ARTISAN TRADE ... ND PRACTICES COUNCIL FOR THE DIRECTORATE, TO REGULATE AND STANDARDISE ARTISAN TRADE AND PRACTICES AND FOR RELATED MATTERS, 2019

Sponsored by Hon, Prestige Ossy Commencement ľ BE IT ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows: 1 1. The National Directorate of Employment Act, Cap N28 Laws of Amendment of the Federation- 2010 (in this Act referred to as the "Principal Act") is the Principal Act 2 3 amended as set out below. 2. Section 2 of the Principal Act is amended by inserting 4 Amendment of immediately after paragraph (b) a new paragraph (c) and re-arranging Section 2 5 6 accordingly; 7 (c) make regulations for the standardization of artisan trade and practices and create standards for accreditation, registration and 8 certification of artisans in order to enhance their quality of service delivery; 9 3. The Principal Act is amended by inserting immediately afte: 10 Section 5, a new sections 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 13 end 14 as follows and re-11 12 arranging the subsequent sections accordingly: 13 6(1) There is hereby established for the Directorate a Council to be known as the "National Artisan Trade and Practices Council" (in this Act 14 referred to as the "Artisan Council"). 15 (2) The Artisan Council shall consist of a Chairman and the 16 following members who shall be appointed by the Minister that is: 17 18 (a) a representative from the following ministry;

13	the work of the Directorate;			
14	(f) six successful artisans being persons who have distinguished			
15	themselves in any of the designated/listed artisan trade, occupation or craft.			
16	(3) The Artisan Council shall:			
17	(a).formulate policies for the standardization of artisan trade and			
18	practices;			
19	(b) define occupational standards, basic work tools, work			
20	environment and set standards to enhance quality of service delivery of			
21	artisans;			
22	(c) develop standards for accreditation, registration and certification			
23	ofartisans;			
24	(d) determine the course content for the various levels of skill			
25	acquisition standard for the National Artisan Certification Standard set out in			
26	the second schedule to this Act;			
27	(e) determine occupations, crafts, and trades for which an artisan			
28	certificate is required;			
29	(f) advice the Board of the Directorate accordingly.			
30	(4) The Artisan Council shall be constituted into such committees

2	7. (a) The Directorate shall list occupations, crafts and trades for			
3	which an Artisan Certificate is required and may remove any such			
4	occupation, craft or trade from the list set out in the first Schedule to this A			
5	if in the opinion of the Directorate an artisan qualification is no long

11	(c) The minimum qualification for an artisan certificate shall be th:			
12	First School Leaving Certificate or its equivalent as set out in the National			
13	Skills Certification Standard set out in the second schedule to this Act.			
14	8. (a) Every person to whom this Act applies shall register with the			
15	Directorate and be issued with a certificate of registration to practice that			
16	trade, occupation or craft;			
17	(b) The certificate of registration shall constitute evidence of			
18	compliance with all the regulations of the Directorate entitling the artisan to			
19	practice the trade indicated on the certificate;			
20	(c) Such certificate shall be displayed conspicuously in the			
21	designated place of work or office of the artisan or shall be produced upon			
22	demand by a prospective client.			
23	9. The Directorate shall:			
24	(a) maintain a register of persons who have obtained an artisan			
25	qualification pursuant to this Act;			
26	(b) maintain a register of persons who are already practicing the			
27	trade prior to the commencement of this Act who may be exempted from			
28	taking a trade test;			
29	(c) determine the criteria and procedure for the name of any person			
30	to be included or removed from the register of artisans;

1	(d) determine the fees payable for registration;			
2	(e) any matter necessary for maintaining the register of artisans.			
3	10. (1) Without prejudice to section 9 subsection (4) paragraph (b), no			
4	person shall obtain an artisan qualification or certificate unless such person			
5	have successfully undergone a trade test administered by an accredited trade			
6	test centre.			
7	(2) The Directorate shall for the purposes of this Act, accredit and			
8	approve test centres that meet the accreditation standard prescribed by the			
9	Directorate; provided always that the accreditation procedures of the			
10	Directorate are not cumbersome or stringent so as to encourage the			
11	development and growth of artisan trade and practices in Niger a.			
12	(3) A person shall apply to undergo a trade test in respect of a trade of			
13	which he has satisfied the relevant apprenticeship or any other learning			
]4	programme, in-house company training, training workshop, job-based or			
15	specialized training resulting in an occupational or vocational qualification			
16	inclusive of prescribed work experience.			
17	(4) The trade test conducted by the Directorate shall focus on the			
18	practical and technical assessment of the standard and level of skill acquisition			
19	by the artisan.			
20	(5) Subject to the provisions of section 10 subsection 6 the Directorate			
21	shall prescribe the fees chargeable by the training centres and test centres.			
22	(6) In determining any fees payable by applicants, the Council shall			
23	ensure that its fees are not excessive or prohibitive.			
24	(7) The Directorate shall make regulations on any matter necessary			
25	and incidental for the conducting or moderating of trade tests.			
26	11.(1) The Directorate shall specify, maintain and monitor			
27	occupational standards by prescribing the necessary basic working tools and			
28	machinery for every occupation, defining the work environment and setting			
29	standards for quality of service delivery by artisans.			

(2) The Directorate shall review from time to time its occupational

1	standards, basic working tools and machinery, working environment				
2	specification and quality of service delivery to reflect current trends and				
3	international best practices in order to encourage the development and				
4	growth of Nigerian Artisan Trade and Practices to international standards.				
5	(3) Upon the coming into force of this Act, the Artisan Counci				
6	shall set deadlines for artisans to regularize their trade practices to confor				
7	to its regulations, made pursuant to the provisions of this Act.				
8	12(1) There shall be established for the Directorate in each State				
9	of the Federation, a State Artisan Trade and Practices Committee (in this Act				
10	referred to as the Artisan Committee), which shall:				
11	(a) coordinate the activities of the Direction in the States;				
12	(b) Iiaise with the State Governments for the implementation of the				
13	programmes of the Directorate in the State.				
14	(2) The Artisan Committee shall consist of a Chairman who shall be				
15	the officer in charge of the State Office of the Ministry and the following				
16	members appointed by the Minister upon nomination by the Governor of				
17	that State:				
18	(a) five successful artisans who have distinguished themselves in				
19	any of the designated/listed occupations, trade or craft;				
20	(b) five other persons, being persons who by reason of any				
21	requisite ability, experience and special knowledge, have skills that would				
22	be useful to the Artisan Committee and would enable them to make effective				
23	contribution to the work of the Directorate.				
24	13.(1) Any member of the Artisan Councilor Artisan Committee				
25	not being a Public Officer shall be paid a sitting allowance in accordance				
26	with the allowances duly approved from time to time by the Minister, as				
27	provided by the Revenue Mobilization Allocation and Fiscal Commission.				
28	(2) Any member of the Artisan Councilor Artisan Committee not				
29	being a public officer shall hold office for four years and shall be eligible for				
30	reappointment for a further period of four years.				

(3) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection 2 of this section, the 1 2 Minister shall have power to remove any member of the Artisan Councilor Artisan Committee. 3 14.(1) No person whether employed or self-employed shall hold 4 himself out to be qualified as an artisan in a listed trade, crart or occupation 5 unless that person is registered as an artisan pursuant to section 6(3) of this Act. 6 (2) Any person who contravenes subsection 1 of this section shall be 7 guilty of an offence and upon conviction shall be liable to 3 years imprisonment 8 or a fine of N10,000. 9 4. Section 11 subsection 2 of the Principal Act is amended by deleting Amendment of 10 Section 11 subsection 2 of paragraphs (a) and (b) and replacing same with a new paragraphs (a) and (b). 11 the Principal Act "2(a) annual budgetary allocation from the federal government; 12 (b) examination fees, registration fees, and accreditation fees;" 13 5. Section 19 of the Principal Act is amended by adding the following Amendment of 14 Section 19 of the Principal Act new interpretations; 15 "artisans" shall include but not limited to auto technicians, refrigerator 16 technicians, barbers, mechanics, electricians, wielders, masons, hair dressers, 17 plumbers, carpenters, tailors, vulcanizes, refrigerator technicians, vehicle and 18 house painters, and such other craftsmen as may from time to time be added to 19 the list by the Artisan Council; 20 "artisan trade" means occupation, trade or craft carried on by artisans and such 21 other trades or crafts as may be so designated by the Artisan Council; 22 "artisan council" means the national artisan trade and practices council 23 established by this act; 24 "First School Leaving Certificate or its equivalent", for the pur poses of this Act 25 shall include the ability to understand and communicate in English language to 26 the satisfaction of the Directorate or any other certificate acceptable to the 27 Directorate. 28 6. This Bill may be cited as the National Directorate of Employment Citation 29 (Amendment) Bill, 2019. 30
