17	(h) one person to represent each of the following broad academic
18	disciplines drawn from different Polytechnics and from different geo-political
19	zones of the Federation:
20	(i) Engineering;
21	(ii) Urban and Regional Planning;
22	(iii) Science and Technology;
23	(iv) Communications;
24	(v) Business Studies; and
25	(vi) Transportation;
26	(i) one representative of the National Commission for Women;
27	(j) one person with a wide knowledge in private or public sector
28	interest drawn from each of the geo-political zones of the Federation;
29	(k) the Executive Secretary of the Commission who shall also be the
30	Secretary of the Council.

16	polytechnics as when considered necessary, and in accordance with the	•
17	Commission's approved guidelines; and	
18	(iii) recommendations for the establishment of new academic unit;	
19	in existing polytechnics or the approval or disapproval of proposals to	
20	establish such academic units;	
21	(c) make such inquiries and investigations relating to polytechnic	
22	education as the Commission may consider necessary in the national	
23	interest;	
24	(d) make such other recommendations to the Federal and State	
25	Governments, relating to polytechnics as the Commission may consider to	
26	be in the national interest;	
27	(e) inquire into and advise the Federal Government on the financial	
28	needs, both recurrent and capital, of polytechnic education in Nigeria and, in	
29	particular, investigate and study the financial needs of polytechnic research	
30	and ensure that adequate provision is made for this in the polytechnics;	

1	(f) receive block grants from the Federal Government and allocate
2	them to polytechnics in accordance with such terms and formula as may be laid
3	down by the Federal Government;
4	(g) take into account, in advising the Federal and Governments on
5	polytechnic finances, such grants as may be made to the polytechnics by State
6	Governments and by persons and institutions in and outside Nigeria;
7	(h) collate, analyse and publish information relating to polytechnic
8	education in Nigeria and obtain information from other sources, where such
9	information is relevant to the discharge of its functions under this Bill;
10	(i) undertake periodic reviews of the terms and conditions of service
11	of personnel engaged in the polytechnics and to make recommendations to the
12	Federal Government, where appropriate:
13	(j) recommend to the visitor of a polytechnic that a visitation be made
14	to such polytechnic as and when it considers such visit necessary;
15	(k) act as the agency for channeling all external aid to the polytechnics
16	in Nigeria;
17	(1) examine departmental syllabuses in polytechnics and approve or
18	disapprove such programmes as the case may be in each of the polytechnics in
19	Nigeria; and
20	(m) in accordance with the provisions of this Bill, carry out such other
21	activities as are conducive to the discharge of its functions under this Bill.
22	(2) The Minister may give the Commission directives of a general
23	character or relating generally to particular matters, with regar 1 to the exercise
24	by the Commission of its functions under this Bill, and it is the duty of the
25	Commission to comply with such directives.
26	Part III - Staff Of The Commission

28	Executive Secretary and such other persons to be employees of the
29	Commission, to assist the Executive Secretary in the exercise of his/her

4	Proceedings of the Council
5	1. Subject to the provisions of this Bill and the Interpretation Act, the
6	Council shall have power to regulate its proceedings and may make standing

17	(2) Every meeting of the Council shall be presided over by the
18	Chairman and if the Chairman is unable to attend a particu ar meeting, the
19	members present at the meeting shall elect one of their member to preside at the
20	meeting.
21	3. The quorum of any meeting of the Council shall consist of the
22	Chairman (or in an appropriate case, the person presiding at the meeting
23	pursuant to paragraph 2(2) of this Schedule) and ten other members.
24	4. The Council shall meet for the conduct of its business at such
25	places and on such days as the Chairman may appoint.
26	5. A question put before the Council at a meeting shall be decided by
27	consensus and where this is not possible, by a majority of the votes of the
28	members present and voting.
29	6. The Chairman shall in the case of an equality of votes have a

casting vote in addition to his deliberative vote.

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1	7. Where the Council seeks the advice of any person on
2	particular matter, the Council may invite that person to attend for such
3	period as it thinks fit, but a person who is invited by virtue of this paragraph
4	shall not be entitled to vote at any meeting of the Council and shall not count
5	towards the quorum.
6	Committees
7	8. The Commission may appoint one or more committees to carry
8	out on behalf of the Commission such of its functions as the Council may
9	determine and report on any matter with which the Commission is
10	concerned.
.11	9. A committee appointed under paragraph 8 of this Schedule shall
12	be presided over by a member of the Council and consist of such number of
13	persons (not necessarily all members of the Commission) as may be
14	determined by the Commission, and a person other than a member of the
15	Council shall hold office in the committee in accordance with the terms of
16	his appointment.
17	10. A decision of a committee of the Commission shall be of no
18	effect until it is confirmed by the Council.
19	Miscellaneous
20	11. The fixing of the seal of the Commission shall be authenticated
21	by the signature of the Chairman and the Executive Secretary or the
22	Executive Secretary and such other person authorised by the Commission to
23	act for that purpose.
24	12. A contract or an instrument which, if made or executed by any
25	person not being a body corporate, would not be required to be under seal,
26	maybe made or executed on behalf of the Commission by the Chairman or
27	the Executive Secretary or by any person generally or specifically
28	authorised to act for that purpose by the Commission.
29	13. A document purporting to be a contract, an instrument or other

document signed or sealed on behalf of the Commission shall be received in

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- 1 evidence and, unless the contrary is proved, be presumed without further proof. 2 to have been properly signed or sealed. 3 14. The validity of any proceedings of the Commission or its 4 committees shall not be affected by: 5 (a) any vacancy in the membership of the Commission or its committees: 7 (b) reason that a person not entitled to do so took part in the 8 proceedings; or Q (c) any defect in the appointment of a member. 10 15. Any member of the Commission or any committee of the Commission who has a personal interest in any contract or arrangement 11 12 entered into or proposed to be considered by the Commission or any of its 13 committee: 14 (a) shall forthwith disclose his interest to the Commission or 15 committee; and 16

## EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

This Bill seeks to establish the National Polytechnics Comm ssion as a body corporate charged with the responsibility of advising the federal and state governments on all aspects of polytechnics education and the general development of polytechnics in Nigeria.
