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ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows:

1 PART 1- ESTABLISHMENT OF THE NIGERIA POLICE ACADEMY

2 **1.** The objects of the Academy are to:

(a) Provide each Officer Cadet with a broad and balanced
curriculum consisting of Police and academic training, general and
professional Police duties designed to serve as a foundation for his
progressive development as an Officer in the Nigeria Police Force;

7 (b) Develop in each Officer cadet, a commitment to those moral
8 qualities and standard required for leadership that are defined by the ideals
9 of unity, honour and service to the country;

10 (c) Encourage the advancement of learning and to hold out the 11 opportunity of acquiring higher education in liberal, scientific, legal, 12 professional and other discipline to Officer cadets of the Nigeria police force 13 and those of other nations that the Federal Government of Nigeria may from 14 time to time decide;

(d) Provide courses of instruction and other facilities for the pursuit
of teaching and learning in all the faculties of the Academy as may be
established and make those facilities available on proper terms to members
of the Nigeria Police as are qualified to benefit from them;

(e) Nurture, equip and produce globally competitive police officerswith requisite knowledge, skills and attitudes suitable for leadership,

16	(g) Conduct research in relevant fields of learning and other human
17	endeavours;
18	(h) Engage top quality lecturers, instructors and other staff of
19	international standards aimed at creating a centre of excellence in mandate
20	fields of study in the Academy;
21	(i) Withdraw from, any cadet of the Academy, for good cause,
22	degree, diploma, certificate, fellowship, studentship, bursary, medal, prize
23	or other academic titles as deemed appropriate by the Academy;
24	(j) Demand and receive from students, except cadets from the
25	Nigeria Police for the purpose of instructions such fees as the Academy, may
26	from time to time, determine;
27	(k) Accept gifts, legacies and donations provided that the terms and
28	conditions attached to such gifts, legacies or donations are not inconsistent
29	with the objects and purpose for the establishment of the Academy;
30	(1) Erect, provide, equip and maintain libraries, parade grounds,

laboratories, lecture halls, halls of residence, refectories, sports grounds,

2	playing fields and other buildings as are necessary for the carrying out of the
3	objects of the Academy under this Act;
4	(m) Hold public and inaugural lectures, symposia and seminars;
5	(n) Undertake printing, publishing and selling of books and journals
6	of the Academy; and
7	(o) Undertake such other activities considered appropriate for a
8	degree-awarding Academy of the highest standard and do all such acts or
9	things that are incidental to the attainment of objects, functions and powers of
10	the Academy under this Act.
11	(2) The Academy shall subject to any limitations or conditions
12	imposed by statute:
13	(a) Invest any money belonging to the Academy by way of
14	endowment, whether for general or special purposes, with power to vary any
15	such investment, from time to time;
16	(b) Invest such other monies as may not be immediately required for
17	current expenditure in any investment or securities and in the purchase or
18	improvement of land, with power to vary any such investments from time to
19	time;

(c) Deposit any monies for the time being not invested with any 20 21 approved bank on deposit or current account; or

(d) Borrow, whether on interest or not and if need be upon the security 22 23 of any of the property movable or immovable of the Academy, such monies as 24 the Council may from time to time require or expedient to borrow or to guarantee any loan, advances or credit facilities. 25

and other facilities needed for the carrying on the mandate of the Academy
