AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE FEDERAL COLLEGE OF AGRICULTURE, BUKUYYUM WHOSE FUNCTION AMONG OTHER THINGS SHALL BE TO PROVIDE FULL-TIME COURSES OF INSTRUCTION AND TRAINING IN AGRICULTURAL SCIENCES AND OTHER ALLIED AREAS; AND ALSO MAKE PROVISION FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF A PROVOST AND THE OFFICIALS OF THE COLLEGE TO CARRY OUT THE ADMINISTRATION OF PROVISIONS OF THE BILL AND THE DISCIPLINE OF STUDENTS OF THE COLLEGE AND FOR RELATED MATTERS

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ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows:

1 PART 1 - ESTABLISHMENT OF THE FEDERAL COLLEGE OF AGRICULTURE,

(d) that the student be expelled from the College.

(4) Where there is temporarily no Provost or where the Provost 12 13 refuses to apply any disciplinary measures, the Council may, either directly or 14 through some other staff, apply such disciplinary actions as are specified in 15 sub-clause {3} of this clause to any student of the College who is guilty of misconduct. 16

17 (5) Where a direction is given under sub-clause (3)(c) or (d) of this clause in respect of any student, the student may, within 21 days from the date 18 of the letter communicating the decision to him, appeal from the direction to 19 20 the Council, and where such an appeal is brought, the Council shall, after causing such inquiry to be made in the matter as the Council considers just, 21 either confirm or set aside the direction or modify it in such manner as the 22 Council may think fit. 23

(6) The fact that an appeal from a direction is brought in pursuance of 24 sub-clause (5) of this clause shall not affect the operation of the direction while 25 the appeal is pending. 26

(7) The Provost may delegate his powers under this clause to a 27 disciplinary committee consisting of such members of the College as he may 28 29 nominate.

(8) Nothing in this clause shall be construed as preventing the 30

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1	restriction or termination of a student's activities at the College otherwise

any particular matter, the Council may co-opt persons who are not members of
the Council but persons co-opted shall not be entitled to vote at a meeting of the
Council.
(5) The quorum of the Council shall be one half of the total members
of the Council, at least one of whom shall be a member appointed by the
President.
(6) Decisions of the Council shall be made on approval by a simple
majority of members.
Miscellaneous
5(1) The fixing of the seal of the College shall be authenticated by
the signature of the chairman, Provost and of some other members of the
Council authorized generally or specially by the Council to act for that
purpose.
(2) Any contract or instrument which, if made or executed by a person
other than a body corporate would not be required to be under seal may be made
or executed on behalf of the College by any person generally or specially

## EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

This Bill seeks to establish the Federal College of Agriculture, Bukuyyum whose function among other things shall be to provide full-time courses of instruction and training in agricultural sciences and other allied areas; and also make provision for the appointment of a Provost and the officials of the College to carry out the administration of provisions of the Bill and the discipline of students of the College.
