	12	intervention and Development in those areas;
	13	(k) Advice the Government on ways of promoting the development of
	14	food technology in Nigeria including introducing appropriate legislation to
	15	enhance food security and vibrancy of the industry;
	16	(1) Perform such other duties, which in the opinion of the Agency are
	17	necessary or expedient to ensure the efficient performance of the functions of
	18	the Agency under this Bill.

	26	(d) Exercise such powers as are necessary of expedient for giving
	27	effect to the provision of this Bill.
	28	PART III - STAFF AND STRUCTURE OF THE AGENCY

14	allowances, benefits and pensions of the staff and employees of the Agency	
15	shall be determined by the Board in such a manner as to attract and retain	
16	quality and high calibre manpower.	
17	(5) The Board shall consider and in consultation with the National	
18	Income and Wages Commission determine and review from time to time the	
19	remunerations and allowances payable to the Agency's staff.	
20	9(1) Service in the Agency shall be approved service for the	Pension Reform

shall not have effect until approved by the Board, and when so approved the

staff in such manner as it may, from time to time, determine.

Director General19Director General of the Agency may, at any time, be removed from office by
2020the President, on recommendation of the Minister, for inability to discharge the
functions of his office (whether arising from infirmity of mind or body or any
other cause) or for misconduct.

(2) The Director General of the Agency may resign his appointment
by a notice in writing under his hand, addressed to the President, through the
Minister, and shall on the date of the receipt of the notice by the President cease
to hold the office of the Director General.

(3) No suit shall be commenced against a member of the Board, the 16 17 Director General or any other officer or employee of the Agency before expiration of a period of one month after written notice of the intension to 18 commence the suit shall have been served on the Agency by the intending 19 20 plaintiff or his agent. (4) The notice referred to in subsection (3) of this section shall clearly 21 22 and explicitly state: 23 (a) The cause of action; 24 (b) The particulars of the claim; (c) The name and place of abode of the intending plaintiff; and 25 26 (d) The relief which he claims. 27 24. A notice, summons or other document required or authorized to Service of Documents be served on the Agency under the provisions of this Bill or any other law or 28 29 enactment may be served by delivering it to the Director General or by sending

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it by registered post addressed to the Director General at the principal office

25.-(1) In any action or suit against the Agency, no execution or attachment of process in the nature thereof shall be issued against the Agency unless not less than three months' notice of the intention to execute or attach has been given to the Agency.

8 been awarded against the Agency shall, subject to any direction given by
9 court, where no notice of appeal against the judgement has been given, be
10 paid from the fund of the Agency.

11 **26.** A member of the Board, the Director General or any officer or 12 employee of the Agency shall be indemnified out of the assets of the Agency 13 against any liability incurred by him in defending any proceeding, whether 14 civil or criminal, if the proceeding is brought against him in his capacity as a 15 member, Director General, officer or employee of the Agency.

This Bill seeks to formally establish the National Agency for the Development of Food Technology, (NADFT) and to set up other high powered intervention to coordinate the implementation of programmes for the advancement of food processing technologies in Nigeria.
