AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE NATIONAL ORIENTATION COMMISSION TO, AMONG OTHER THINGS, RE-ORIENTATE AND ENCOURAGE NIGERIANS TO TAKE PART ACTIVELY AND FREELY IN DISCUSSIONS AND DECISIONS AFFECTING THEIR GENERAL AND COLLECTIVE WELFARE, AND TO INCULCATE IN NIGERIANS THE CONSCIOUSNESS OF NATIONALISM AND NATION BUILDING IN ALL ASPECTS OF LIFE AND FOR RELATED MATTERS

Sponsored by Hon. Olajide Olatubosun 1 Commencement ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria: 1 1.-(1) There is hereby established a body to be known as the Establishment of National 2 Orientation National Orientation Commission (in this Bill referred to as "the Commission 3 Commission") which shall have the functions assigned to it by this Bill. - (4) Any proceeding or cause of action pending or existing immediately before the commencement of this Act by or against the Agency existing before the commencement of this Act in respect of any right, interest, obligation or liability of the Agency existing before the commencement of this Act may be continued or as the case may be commenced, and any determination of a court of law, tribunal or other authority or person may be enforced by or against the Commission established by this Act to the same extent that such proceeding or cause of action or determination might have been continued, commenced or enforced by or against the Directorate and Divisions existing before the commencement of this Act.
- (5) All assets, funds, resources and other movable or immovable property which immediately before the commencement of this Act were vested in the Agency existing before the commencement of this Bill shall, by virtue of this Act and without further assurance, be vested in the Commission established by this Bill.
- (6) Any person who immediately before the coming into effect of this Act is the holder of any office in Agency existing before commencement of this Act shall, on the commencement of this Act, continue in office and be deemed to have been appointed to his office by the Commission established by this Bill unless the authority by which the person was appointed terminates the appointment.
- (7) The Minister may, if he thinks fit, within twelve months after the commencement of this Bill by order published in the Federal Gazette make additional transitional or savings provisions for better carrying out of the objectives of this clause.

Staff regulations

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Interpretation

24.-(1) The Commission may, with the approval of the Minister, make staff regulations relating generally to the conditions of service of the employees of the Commission and without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, such regulations may provide for: (a) the appointment, promotion and disciplinary control of all employees of the Commission; and (b) appeals by such employees against dismissal or other disciplinary measures, and until such regulations are made, any instrument relating to the conditions of service of employees of the Agency dissolved or affected by this Bill immediately before the making of this Bill, shall continue in force and have the same effect as if made under this Bill. (2) Regulations made under sub-clause(1) of this clause need not be published in the Federal Gazette but the Commission shall bring them to the notice of all affected persons in such manner as it may, from time to time, determine. 25. In this Bill, unless the context otherwise requires: "Commission" means the National Orientation Commission established under clause 1 of this Bill; "Chairman" means the chairman of the Board; "Director-General" means the Director-General of the Commission appointed pursuant to clause 6 of this Bill; "Local Government Formation" means any of the local government offices of the Commission established in each local government area of the Federation by clause 14 of this Bill; "member" means a member of the Board and includes the chairman;

"Minister" means the Minister charged with the responsibility for information and national orientation; "State Directorate" means any of the State offices of

the Commission established in each State of the Federation and the Federal

Capital Territory, Abuja by clause 12 of this Bill.

## EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

This Bill seeks to establish the National Orientation Commission to, among other things, re-orientate and encourage Nigerians to take part actively and freely in discussions and decisions affecting their general and collective welfare, and to inculcate in Nigerians the consciousness of Nationalism and Nation building in all aspects of life.
