Cessation of Membership	15	4(1) A person shall cease to hold office as member of the Governing

24	(d) to implement all the measures approved for environmental	
25	health and safety by the Federal Government;	
26	(f) to identify factors militating against environmental health and	
27	safety in the country;	
28	(g) to liaise with other health and environmental institutions to	
29	ensure best global safety practices.	
30	(h) to ensure sound and efficient management of the resources	

	1	available to the Agency from the Federation Account; and
	2	(i) to carry out such other functions as the President may from time to
	3	time direct.
Powers of the	4	8. The Agency shall have power to anything which will facilitate the
Agency	5	carrying out of its functions and in particular may:
	6	(a) sue and be sued in its corporate name;
	7	(b) acquire. hold and manage moveable and immoveable properly:
	8	(c) enter into contracts for the restoration of the environment;
	9	(d) purchase. or acquire any asset; business or property considered
	10	necessary for the proper conduct of its functions:
	11	(c) sell, let. lease or dispose of any of its property:
	12	(d) undertake or sponsor research where necessary, for the
	13	performance of its functions: and
	14	(g) train managerial, technical or other category of staff for the
	15	purpose of running the affairs of the Agency.
	16	(2) The powers conferred on the Agency may be exercised by it or
	17	$through \ any \ of its \ employees \ or \ agents \ authorized \ in \ that \ behalf \ by \ the \ Agency.$
	18	PART III - APPOINTMENT OF DIRECTOR-CENERAL AND OTHER STAFF
Appointment of the Director	19	9(1) There shall be for the Agency. a Director-General, who shall be

	21	(2) The Director-General shall:
	22	(a) have such qualifications and experience as are appropriate for a
	23	person required to perform the functions of that office under this Act;
	24	(b) hold office for a term of 5 years in the first instance and may be re-
	25	appointed for another term of 5 years and no more:
	26	(c) be responsible to the Governing Council for policy direction and
	27	the day-to-day administration of the Agency; and
	28	(d) hold office on terms and conditions as may be contained in his
	29	letter of appointment.

1	10(1) The Agency shall, with the approval of the Minister have	
2	power to establish such departments to assist it in the performance of its	
3	duties and functions under this Act.	
4	(2) The Director-General shall appoint Directors to head each	
5	department, established pursuant to subsection (1) of this section and each	
6	Director shall have the requisite qualification and experience of not less than	
7	20 years as may be required for the effective implementation or the	
8	functions of their respective departments and the Agency under this Act.	
9	11(1) The Agency may, with the approval of the Governing	Appointment of
10	Council, appoint such other staff or employees as. in the opinion of the	other staff of the Agency
11	Agency, may be expedient and necessary for the proper and efficient	
12	performance of its functions under this Act.	
13	(2) The terms and conditions of service (including remuneration,

16	(3) The Agency shall have power to appoint either on transfer or on	
17	secondment from an public service in the Federation such employees as

19	discharge of any of its functions under this Act, and shall have power to pay	
20	to persons so employed such remuneration (including, allowances) as the	
21	Governing Council may, alter consultation with the National Salaries and	
22	Wages Commission determine.	
23	12(1) The Governing Council may, subject to the provisions of	Staff regulation
24	this Act, make staff regulations relating generally to the conditions of	
25	service or the employees of the Agency and without prejudice to the	
26	generality of the foregoing, such regulations may provide for:	
27	(a) the appointment, promotion and disciplinary control (including	
28	dismissal) of employees of the Agency: and	
29	(b) appeals by such employees against dismissal or other	
30	disciplinary measures, and until such regulations are made. any instrument

	4	not have effect until approved by the Minister and when so approved they need

20	(2) The Agency shall not accept any gift if the conditions attached	
21	by the person or organization making the gift are inconsistent with the	
22	functions of the Commission under this Act.	
23	17(1) The Agency shall not later than 30th September in each	Annual estimates
24	year, submit to the National Assembly through the President an estimate of	and expenditure
25	the expenditure and income of the Agency during the next succeeding year.	
26	(2) The accounts of the Agency shall be audited not later than 2	
27	months after the end of each financial year by auditors appointed from the	
28	list and in accordance with the guidelines supplied by the Auditor-General

Interpretation	14	22. In this Act unless the context otherwise requires:
	15	"Agency" means the Environmental Health and Safety Agency established

	24	"Minister" means the Minister charged with the responsibility for

2	Section 2(4)
3	SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS RELATING TO THE
4	GOVERNING COUNCIL, ETC.
5	Proceedings of the Governing Council
6	1(1) Subject to this Act and section 27 of the Interpretation Act,
7	the Governing Council may make standing orders regulating its proceedings
8	or those of any of its committees.
9	(2) The quorum of the Governing Council shall be the Chairman, or
10	the person presiding at the meeting and 4 other members of the Governing
11	Council, and the quorum of any committee of the Governing Council shall
12	be determined by the Governing Council,
13	2(1) The Governing Council shall meet not less than four times in
14	each year and subject thereto, the Governing Council shall meet whenever it
15	is summoned by the Chairman and if the Chairman is required to do so by
16	notice given to him by not less than 4 other members, he shall summon a
17	meeting of the Governing Council to be held within 28 days from the date on
18	which the notice is given.
19	(2) At any meeting of the Governing Council the Chairman shall
20	preside but if he is absent, the members present shall appoint one of their
21	number to preside at that meeting.
22	(3) Where the Governing Council desires to obtain the advice of
23	any person on a particular matter, the Governing Council may co-opt him to
24	the Governing Council for such period as it deems Ill. but a person who is in
25	attendance by virtue of this sub-section shall nor be entitled to vote at any
26	meeting of the Governing Council and shall not count towards a quorum.
27	Committees
28	3(1) The Governing Council may appoint one or more
29	committees to carry out, on behalf of the Governing Council, such functions
30	as the Governing Council may determine.

1	(2) A committee appointed under this paragraph shall consist of such
2	number of persons as may be determined by the Governing Council and II
3	person shall hold office on the committee in accordance with the terms of his
4	appointment.
5	(3) A decision of a committee shall be of no effect until it is confirmed
6	by the Governing Council.
7	Miscellaneous
8	4(1) The fixing of the seal of the Agency shall be authenticated by
9	the signatures of the Chairman or any person generally or specifically
10	authorized by the Governing Council to ad [or that purpose and the Director-
11	General.
12	(2) Any contract or instrument which, if made or executed by a person
13	not being a body corporate, would not be required to be under seal, may be
14	made or executed on behalf of the Agency by the Director-General or any
15	person generally or specifically authorized by the Governing Council to act for
16	that purpose,
17	(3) Any document purporting to be a document duly executed under
18	the seal of the Agency shall be received in evidence and shall, unless and until
19	the contrary is proved. be presumed to be so executed,
20	5. The validity of any proceedings of the Governing Council or of a
21	committee shall not be adversely affected by:
22	(a) a vacancy in the membership of the Governing Councilor
23	committee;
24	(b) a defect in the appointment of 3 member of the Governing
25	Councilor committee; or
26	(c) reason that a person not entitled to do so took part in the
27	proceedings of the Governing Councilor committee.
28	6. Any member of the Governing Council and any person sitting on
29	the Governing Councilor committee, who has a personal interest in any
30	contract, arrangement or matter to be considered by the Governing Councilor

- 1 committee thereof shall forthwith disclose his interest to the Governing
- 2 Councilor committee and shall not vote on any question relating to the
- 3 contract, arrangement or matter.
