- (8) The Council shall meet as and when necessary for the performance of its functions under this Act, and shall meet at least four times every year.
- (9) If required in writing by any five members of the Council, the Chairman shall within twenty-eight days after the receipt of such request call a meeting of the Council:

PROVIDED that if after 28 days of the receipt or delivering to him of such request, the chairman fails or neglects to call a meeting, the Registrar shall-within 14 days thereof, cause a meeting of the Council to be convened for that purpose. The request shall specify the business to be considered at the meeting and no business not so specified shall be transacted at that meeting.

8.-(1) Subject to section 5 of this Act and subsections (3) and (4) of this section and to the provisions of this Act relating to the Visitor, it shall be the general function of the Senate to organize and control teaching in the University, admission to Postgraduate courses and other admission of students, the discipline of students and to promote research in the University.

18.-(1) If, on the recommendation of the Vice-Chancellor, it appears to the Senate that a person a poi ted as an examiner for any examination of the University ought to be removed from his office or appointment, then, the Senate may, after affording the examiner an opportunity of making representations in person on the matter, direct the Vice-Chancellor to remove the examiner by an instrument in writing signed by the Registrar.

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(2) Subject to the provisions of any regulation made pursuant to section 8 (4) of this Act, the Vice-Chance lor may, on the recommendation of Senate, appoint an appropriate person as examiner in the place of the examiner removed.

## EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

This Bill seeks to establish the Federal University of Agriculture, Lalaipido to develop and offer academic and professional training particularly in the field of Agriculture and to act as a catalyst for the agricultural advancement of the Country.
