Establishment of the Congregation
10. There shall be for the polytechnic, a Congregation consisting of
both Academic and Senior Non-Teaching staff, who holds at least a first degree
or its equivalent the:
(a) Rector shall be the Chairman of the Congregation; and
(b) Congregation shall meet at least once in a year.
11. Any contract or instrument which if entered into by a person not
being a body corporate would not be required to be under seal, may in like
manner be entered into or executed on behalf of the Council by any person
generally or specifically authorised by it for that purpose.
12(1) The common seal of the Council shall not be used or affixed to
any document except in pursuance of a resolution duly passed at a properly
constituted meeting of the Council and recorded in the minutes of such
meeting.
(2) The fixing of the seal of the Council shall be authenticated by the
signature of the Chairman of the Council and some other members authorised
generally or specifically by the Council to act for that purpose.
(3) Any document purporting to be a document duly executed under
the seal of the Council shall be received in evidence and shall, unless the
contrary is proved, be deemed to be so executed.
13. Any member of the Councilor a committee thereof who has a
personal interest in any contract or arrangement entered into or proposed to be
considered by the Council or a committee thereof, shall forthwith disclose his
interest to the Council and shall not vote on any question relating to such
contract or arrangement.
