INFORMATION COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGY SULEJA, NIGER STATE; AND FOR OTHER MATTERS CONNECTED THEREWITH, 2020 Sponsored by Senator Musa, Mohammed Sani ſ 1 Commencement ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows: PART I - ESTABLISHMENT OF INSTITUTE OF INFORMATION 1 2 COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGY SULEJA, NIGER STATE 1.-(1) As from the commencement of this Bill, the Institute of 3 Establishment of Institute of Information Communication Technology Suleja, Niger State (in this Bill Information 4 Communication Technology Suleja, referred to as "the Institute") shall be known and referred to as Institute of 5 Niger State 6 Information Communication Technology Suleja, Niger State. (2) There is established a polytechnic to be known as the Institute 7 of Information Communication Technology Suleja, Niger State (in this Bill 8 referred to as the Institute). 9 2.-(1) There shall be established a Council for the Institute (in this 10 Establishment and Composition Bill referred to as "the Council") which shall be a body corporate with 11 of the Council of the Institute perpetual succession and a common seal and may sue and be sued in its 12 13 corporate name. (2) The Council shall consist of a Chairman and the following other 14 15 members, that is: (a) the Rector of the Institute; 16 17 (b) one representative of the Academic Board of the Institute elected by the Board; 18 19 (c) one representative of Manufacturer's Association of Nigeria. MAN (to be coordinated by NBTE); 20

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(d) one representative of Universities (to be submitted by NUC);

	13	(k) one representative of the State Ministry of Education;
	14	(1) five (5) other persons, at least one of whom must be a woman to be
	15	selected each on personal merit based on contributions to development of

	17	(m) the Registrar (non-member) shall be Secretary to the Governing
	18	Council.
	19	(3) The Chairman and members for the Council other than ex-officio
	20	members shall be appointed by the President on the recommendation of the
	21	Minister of Education.
	22	(4) The provision of the Schedule to this Bill shall have effect with
	23	respect to the proceedings of the Council and the other matters mentioned
	24	therein.
Visitation	25	<b>3</b> (1) The Minister of Education shall be the Visitor to the Institute.
	26	(2) The Visitor shall not less than once in every five (5) years conduct
	27	a visitation to the polytechnic by appointing a Visitation Panel.
	28	(3) The Visitation Panel shall consist of not less than five (5) experts
	29	in relevant areas as provided in section 6 (1) (a) of this Bill to:
	30	(a) evaluate academic and administrative performance of the

3	<b>4</b> (1) The Chairman and other members of the Governing Council	Tenure of Office

27	(c) to arrange conferences, seminars and study groups relevant to	
28	the fields of learning specified in sub section (1)(a) in this section;	
29	(d) to perform such other functions which in the opinion of the	
30	Institute, may serve to promote its objectives;	

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(e) to provide a well-developed and articulate technical education

	2	through consistent research, development and constant contact with renowned
	3	institutions and appropriate industries;
	4	(f) to provide appropriate training and vocational dexterity for a self-
	5	reliant and focused Nigerian student, and also to provide industrial skills for
	6	those who want to be employers of labour or gainfully employed;
	7	(g) to perform such other functions as in the opinion of the Council,
	8	may serve to promote the objectives of the Institute; and
	9	(h) to carry out other activities as are necessary and expedient for the
	10	full discharge of any of its functions pursuant to this Bill.
Functions of	11	<b>6.</b> -(1) Subject to the provisions of this Bill, the Council:

	13	the Institute and in particular, the control of the property and finances of the

	15	(b) shall have power to do anything which in its opinion is calculated

	18	(c) shall set up committees for the purpose of working on specific
	19	matters and making recommendations to the Board for necessary action;

23	(b) Where a vacancy occurs in the position of Rector, the Council	
24	shall advertise and follow such procedure as provided in sections 8 (2), (3),	
25	(4) and (5) of the Federal Polytechnics Act;	
26	(c) The Rector shall be responsible for:	
27	(i) the day-to-day administration of the Institute;	
28	(ii) the exercise of general authority over the employees of the	
29	Institute;	
30	(iii) the discipline of students in the Institute.	

1	(d) The Rector shall hold office for a period of four (4) years from the
2	effective date of his appointment and on such terms and conditions as may be
3	determined by the Minister as set out in his letter of appointment;
4	(e) The Rector may be re-appointed for a further period of four (4)
5	years and no more.
6	Appointment of the Deputy Rector
7	(2) (a) The Deputy Rector shall be appointed by the Council as
8	specified in section 9 of the Federal Polytechnics Act;
9	(b) The Deputy Rector shall assist the Rector in the performance of his
10	functions and shall act in the place of the Rector when the Rector is absent or
11	unable to perform his functions or when the position of Rector is vacant;
12	(c) The Deputy Rector shall perform such other functions as the
13	Rector may from time to time assign;
14	(d) The Deputy Rector shall hold office for the period of two (2) years
15	from the effective date of his appointment and on such terms and conditions as
16	may be specified in the letter of appointment. He may be re-appointed for a
17	further period of two (2) years and no more.
18	Appointment of the Registrar
19	(3) (a) The Council shall appoint a Registrar who shall be the
20	secretary to the Council and attend all the meetings of the Council.;
21	(b) The Registrar shall be answerable to the Rector for the day-to-day
22	administration of the polytechnic and shall perform such other duties as the
23	Council or Rector may direct;
24	(c) The Registrar shall be Secretary to the Council, Academic Board
25	and any other committees of the Council and shall attend all meetings of these
26	committees unless excused for good reasons by the Chairman of the Council;
27	(d) If the Registrar is for any reason unable to attend a meeting of the
28	Council, the Chairman of the Council may, after consultation with the Rector,
29	appoint a suitable person to act as secretary for the particular meeting;
30	(e) The Secretary to Council or a person appointed to act under

23	services in the academic unit of the polytechnic;

	27	Proceedings of the Board
	28	1(1) Subject to this Bill and section 27 of the Interpretation Act, the
	29	Council may make standing orders regulating the proceedings of the Council
	30	or any committee thereof.

1	(2) The quorum of the Council shall be seven (7) and the quorum of
2	any committee of the Council shall be as determined by the Council.
3	2(1) The Council shall meet for the conduct of business at such
4	times as the Chairman of the Council may appoint but shall meet not less
5	than twice in a year and not more than four (4) times in each year and two (2)
6	emergencies.

24	shall not be entitled to vote at any meeting of the Council and shall not count

26	(7) The Registrar of the Polytechnic shall serve as the Secretary but
27	non-member of Board. He shall not be considered for the purpose of a
28	quorum and shall have no voting right.

30	3(1) The Council may appoint one or more committee(s) to carry

1	out on behalf of the Council such functions as the Council may determine.
2	(2) A committee appointed under this paragraph shall consist of such
3	number of persons (not necessarily all members of the Council) as may be
4	determined by the Council; and a person, other than a member of the Council,
5	shall hold office on the committee in accordance with the terms of his
6	appointment.
7	(3) A decision of a committee of the Council shall be of no effect until
8	it is confirmed by the Council.
9	Miscellaneous
10	4(1) The fixing of the seal of the Council shall be authenticated by
11	the signature of the Chairman and of any other member authorized generally or
12	specially by the Council to act for that purpose.
13	(2) Any contract or instrument which, if made by a person not being a
14	body corporate, would not be required to be under seal, may be made or
15	executed on behalf of the Institute by the Rector or any person generally or
16	specially authorized to act for that purpose by the Council.
17	(3) Any document purporting to be a document duly executed under
18	the seal of the Institute shall be received in evidence and shall, unless the
19	contrary is proved, be presumed to be so executed.
20	(4) Members of the Council who are not public officers shall be paid
21	off of moneys at the disposal of the Council such remuneration; fee or
22	allowances in accordance with such scale as may be approved, from time to
23	time, by the President.
24	(5) The validity of any proceedings of the committee of a Council
25	thereof shall not be adversely affected by a vacancy in the membership of the
26	committee of a Council or by reason that a person not entitled to do so took part
27	in the proceedings.
28	(6) Any member of the Council or any person holding office in a
29	committee of the Council who has a personal interest in any contract or
30	arrangement entered into or proposed to be considered by the Council or

- 1 committee thereof shall forthwith disclose his interest to the Council or
- 2 committee and shall not vote on any question relating to the contract or arrangement.

## EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

This Bill seeks to establish the Institute of Information Communication Technology Suleja, Niger State to provide full-time and part-time courses of instruction and training in Construction Technology, Engineering Technology, Applied Sciences, Management Sciences and other fields of study and to make provisions for the general administration of the Institute.
