

# A BILL

## FOR

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE FEDERAL POLYTECHNIC, SILAME, SOKOTO STATE; AND FOR OTHER MATTERS CONNECTED THEREWITH

*Sponsored by Senator Wammako*

[ ] Commencement

ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows :

1           1.-(1) There is established the Federal Polytechnic Silame,  
2 SokotoState which shall have such powers and exercise such functions as is  
3 conferred on it by this Act.

Establishment

State

4           (2) The Polytechnic shall be a body corporate with perpetual  
5 succession and a common seal and shall have power to acquire and dispose  
6 of interests in movable and immovable property and may sue and be sued in  
7 its corporate name.

8           2. The functions of the Polytechnic shall be to:

Functions of the  
Polytechnic

9           (a) to provide full-time and part-time courses of instruction and  
10 training to produce middle and high level manpower:

11           (i) in technology, applied science, commerce and management;  
12 and

13           (ii) in such other fields of applied learning relevant to the needs of  
14 the development of Nigeria in the areas of industrial and agricultural  
15 production and distribution and for research in the development and  
16 adaptation of techniques as the Council may from time to time determine;

17           (b) to arrange conference, seminars and study groups relative to  
18 the fields of learning specified in paragraph (a) of this subsection(1);

19           © to perform such other functions as in the opinion of the Council  
20 may serve to promote the objectives of the Polytechnic.

Establishment  
and Constitution  
of the Council,  
etc.

1 (2) Nothing in this section shall preclude the government of a State or  
2 any of its agencies from setting up a polytechnic similar to any polytechnic  
3 established under this Act.

4 3.-(1) There shall be established for the Polytechnic a Governing  
5 Council (hereafter in this Act referred to as "the Council").

6 (2) The Council shall consist of a Chairman and the following other  
7 members:

8 (a) four persons representing a variety of interests and broadly  
9 representative of the whole Federation, at least one of whom shall be a woman;

10 (b) one person to represent the alumni association;

11 (c) a representative of the community where the Polytechnic is  
12 situated;

13 (d) the Rector;

14 (e) the Deputy Rector(s);

15 (f) one person representing the Federal Ministry of Education or  
16 regulatory agency;

17 (g) two persons not below the rank of Chief Lecturer elected by the  
18 Academic Board from among its members;

19 (h) three persons not below the rank of Senior Lecturer or its  
20 equivalent elected by the Congregation from among its members in which one  
21 shall be non-teaching staff.

22 (3)(i) The Chairman and members of the Council other than ex-  
23 officio members shall be appointed by the President and Commander-in-Chief  
24 of the Armed Forces;

25 (ii) Persons to be appointed to the Council shall be persons of proven  
26 integrity, knowledgeable and acquainted with the working and tradition of the  
27 Technical and Vocational Education.

28 (4) Any member of the Council other than an ex-officio member shall  
29 hold office for a period of three years at the first instance and may be eligible for  
30 re-appointment for another period of three years and no more.

1 (5) The governance structure of the Polytechnic shall be composed

2 of:

3 (a) Governing Council;

4 (b) Academic Board;

5 (c) Management Committee;

6 (d) School Board; and

7 (e) Departmental Board.

8 (6) The provisions set out in the First Schedule to this Bill, shall  
9 apply in relation to the Council governance structure and other matters  
10 therein specified.

11 4.-(1) The President and Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Visitation  
12 Forces shall be the Visitor to the Polytechnic.

13 (2) The Visitor shall, not less than once in every five years, conduct  
14 a visitation of the college or appoint a Visitation Panel, consisting of not less  
15 than five experts, to conduct the visitation-

16 (a) for the purpose of evaluating the academic and administrative  
17 performance of the Polytechnic;

18 (b) for such other purpose or in respect of any other affairs of the  
19 Polytechnic as the Visitor may deem fit. [1993 No. 5]

20 5.-(1) There shall be a Registrar to the Polytechnic who shall be Registrar of the  
Polytechnic  
21 responsible to the Rector for the day-to-day administration of the  
22 polytechnic and shall perform such other duties as the Council or as the case  
23 may be, the Rector may from time to time require him.

24 (2) The Registrar shall be the Secretary to the Council, the  
25 Academic Board and any committee of the Council and shall attend all the  
26 meetings of those bodies unless excused for good reason by the chairman of  
27 the Council.

28 (3) In the absence of the Registrar, the Chairman of the Council  
29 may, after consultation with the Rector, appoint a suitable person to act as  
30 Secretary for any particular meeting of the Council.

1 (4) The Secretary to the Council or a person appointed to act under  
2 subsection (3) of this section, shall not vote on any question before the Council  
3 or count towards a quorum unless he is so entitled as a member of the  
4 Council.

Tenure of office  
of the Registrar

5 6.-(1) A Registrar shall hold office for a single tenure of five years  
6 beginning from the effective date of his appointment and on such terms and  
7 conditions as may be specified in the letter of his appointment;

8 (2) Where a Registrar has held office for five years or less on the  
9 commencement of this Act, he shall be deemed to have been serving his final  
10 term of office.

General functions  
of the Council

11 7.-(1) Subject to provision of this Act, the Council shall be the  
12 governing body of the Polytechnic concerned and shall have the general  
13 management of the affairs of the Polytechnic, and in particular, the control of  
14 the property and finances of the polytechnic; and shall have power to do  
15 anything which in its opinion is calculated to facilitate the carrying out of the  
16 activities of the Polytechnic and promote its best interests.

17 (2) The Council may acquire and hold such movable or immovable  
18 property as may be necessary or expedient for carrying into effect the  
19 provisions of this Act, and for the same purpose may sell, lease, mortgage or  
20 otherwise alienate or dispose of any property so acquired.

21 (3) The Council may enter into such contracts as may be necessary or  
22 expedient for carrying into effect the provisions of this Act.

23 (4) The Minister may give to the Council directions of a general  
24 character or relating generally to particular matters (but not any individual  
25 person or case) with regard to the exercise by the Council of its functions and it  
26 shall be the duty of the Council to comply with the directions.

The Rector of  
the Polytechnic

27 8.-(1) There shall be a Rector for the Polytechnic ("the Rector") who  
28 shall be appointed by the President, Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces  
29 in accordance with the provision of this section.

1 (2) Where a vacancy occurs in the post of the Rector, the Council  
2 shall:

3 (a) advertise the vacancy not later than six (6) months to the  
4 expiration of the term of the sitting Rector in not less than two national  
5 newspapers in Nigeria, specifying:

6 (i) the qualifications of the persons who may apply for the post,  
7 who shall be a Chief Lecturer in the Polytechnic sector with at least five  
8 years of experience on that position among other criteria ; and

9 (ii) the terms and conditions of service applicable to the post, and  
10 thereafter, draw up a short list of suitable candidates for consideration;

11 (b) constitute a Search Team consisting of:

12 (i) a member of the Council, not being a member of the Academic  
13 Board, as Chairman;

14 (ii) two members of the Academic Board, not below the rank of  
15 Chief Lecturer;

16 (iii) two members of Academic Staff not below the rank of Chief  
17 Lecturers to be elected from among its members.

18 (3) A Joint Council, Academic Board and Congregation Selection  
19 Board consisting of:

20 (a) the Chairman of the Council;

21 (b) two members of the Council not being members of the  
22 Academic Board;

23 (c) two members of the Academic Board not below the rank of  
24 Chief Lecturer, who were not members of the Search Team elected among  
25 its members; and

26 (d) two members of the Congregation not below the rank of Chief  
27 Lecturer who were not members of the Search Team elected among its  
28 members, shall consider the candidates on the short list drawn up under  
29 subsection (2) of this section through an examination of their curriculum  
30 vitae and interaction with them and recommend in order of performance

1 ranking through the Council, to the President and Commander-in-Chief of the  
2 Armed Forces, three candidates for his consideration.

3 (4) The President shall appoint, as Rector, one of the candidates  
4 recommended to him under the provisions of subsection (3) of this section.

5 (5) Subject to this Act and the general control of the Council, the  
6 Rector shall be the Chief Executive of the Polytechnic and shall be charged  
7 with general responsibility for matters relating to the day-to-day management  
8 operations of the Polytechnic.

9 (6) The Rector shall:

10 (a)(i) hold office for a single term of five years beginning with the  
11 effective date of his appointment and on such terms and conditions as may be  
12 specified in his letter of appointment;

13 (ii) where a Rector was appointed on four-year tenure on the  
14 commencement of this Act, his tenure shall be extended for a period of one year  
15 to complete the single-tenure of five years in line with subsection (6) (a) above;

16 (iii) where a Rector is serving second tenure of four years on the  
17 commencement of this Act, he shall be deemed to have been serving his final  
18 term of office.

19 (b) have power to exercise general authority over staff and be  
20 responsible for discipline in the Polytechnic; and

21 (c) his remuneration shall be determined by the National Salaries and  
22 Wages Commission.

Deputy Rectors 23 **9.-(1)** There shall be for the Polytechnic such number of Deputy  
24 Rectors as the Council may, from time to time, deem necessary for the proper  
25 administration of the Polytechnic.

26 (2) Where a vacancy occurs in the post of Deputy Rector, the Rector  
27 shall forward to the Academic Board a list of two candidates for each post of  
28 Deputy Rector that is vacant.

29 (3) The Academic Board shall elect for each vacant post one candidate  
30 from each list forwarded to it under subsection (2) of this section and forward

1 his name to the Council for confirmation.

2 (4) Where-

3 (a) the Academic Board rejects the two candidates forwarded to it  
4 by the Rector under subsection (2) of this section, the Rector shall submit  
5 another list;

6 (b) the Council rejects the name sent to it under subsection (3) of  
7 this section, the Academic Board shall send the name of the other candidate  
8 on the list forwarded to it by the Rector under subsection (2) of this section.

9 (5) The Deputy Rector(s) shall:

10 (a) assist the Rector in the performance of his functions;

11 (b) act in the place of the Rector when the post of Rector is vacant  
12 or if the Rector is for any reason absent or unable to perform their functions  
13 as Rector; and

14 (c) perform such other functions as the Rector or the Council may  
15 from time to time assign to him.

16 (6) The Deputy Rectors:

17 (a) shall hold office for a single tenure of four years beginning from  
18 the effective date of his appointment and on such terms and conditions as  
19 may be specified in his letter of appointment;

20 (b) where a Deputy Rector was appointed on a two year tenure on  
21 the commencement of this Act, his tenure shall be extended for a period of  
22 two years to complete the single-tenure of four years in line with subsection  
23 (6) (a) above;

24 (c) where a Deputy Rector is serving second tenure of two years on  
25 the commencement of this Act, he shall be deemed to have been serving his  
26 final term of office.

27 **10.-(1)** There shall be for the polytechnic the following other  
28 principal officers in addition to the Deputy Rector(s):

29 (a) the Registrar;

30 (b) the Bursar; and

Other Principal  
officers of the  
Polytechnic

1 (c) the Polytechnic Librarian,  
2 who shall be appointed by the Council on the recommendation of the Selection  
3 Board constituted under section 12 of this Act.

4 (2) The Bursar shall be the Chief Financial Officer of the Polytechnic  
5 and be responsible to the Rector for the day-to-day administration and control  
6 of the financial affairs of the Polytechnic.

7 (3) The Polytechnic Librarian shall be responsible to the Rector for  
8 the administration of the polytechnic library and the co-ordination of the  
9 library services in the teaching units of the Polytechnic.

10 (4) The Bursar or Librarian-

11 (a) shall hold office for a single tenure of five years beginning from  
12 the effective date of his appointment and on such terms and conditions as may  
13 be specified in his letter of appointment;

14 (b) where a Bursar or Librarian has held office for five years or less on  
15 the commencement of this Act, he shall be deemed to have been serving his  
16 final term of office.

Resignation of  
appointment of  
Principal Officers

17 **11.** A Principal Officer may resign his appointment:

18 (a) in the case of the Rector, by notice to the Visitor;

19 (b) in any other case by notice to the Council.

Selection Board  
for other Principal  
Officers

20 **12.**-(1) There shall be, for the Polytechnic a Selection Board which  
21 shall consist of:

22 (a) the Chairman of the Council;

23 (b) the Rector;

24 (c) four members of the Council not being members of the Academic  
25 Board;

26 (d) two members of the Academic Board not being members of  
27 Council and not below the rank of Chief Lecturer elected from among its  
28 members; and.

29 (e) three members of the Congregation not below the rank of Principal  
30 Lecturer or its equivalent elected from among its members in which one shall



1 be a non-teaching staff.

2 (2) The functions and procedure and other matters relating to the  
3 Selection Board constituted under subsection (1) of this section shall be as  
4 the Council may, from time to time, determine.

5 13.-(1) The Council may appoint such other persons to be  
6 employees of the Polytechnic as the Council may determine to assist the  
7 Rector and the Principal Officers of the Polytechnic in the performance of  
8 their functions under this Act.

Other employees  
of the Polytechnic

9 (2) The power to appoint all other employees of the polytechnic  
10 shall be exercised:

11 (a) in the case of senior employees, by the Council on the  
12 recommendation of Appointment and Promotions Committee set up under  
13 the provisions of paragraph 3(2)(a) of the First Schedule to this Act;

14 (b) in the case of junior employees, by the Rector on the  
15 recommendation of the Junior Staff Appointment and Promotions  
16 Committee constituted under paragraph 3(2)(b) of the First Schedule to this  
17 Act.

18 (3) Subject to the provisions of this Act, the remuneration, tenure of  
19 office and conditions of service of the employees of the Council shall be  
20 determined by the Council in consultation with the Federal Civil Service  
21 Commission.

22 14.-(1) The Federal Civil Service Commission may by order  
23 published in the Federal Gazette declare the office of the Rector or any other  
24 person employed by the Council to be a pensionable office for the purposes  
25 of the Pensions Act.

Application of  
the Pensions Act

26 *[Cap. P4]*

27 (2) Nothing in the provisions of subsection (1) of this section shall  
28 prevent the appointment of any person to any office on terms which preclude  
29 the grant of a pension or gratuity in respect of service in that office.

30 (3) A law or rule requiring a person to retire from the Public Service

1 after serving for thirty five (35) years or having attained the age of 60 years in  
2 service, shall not apply to staff of Polytechnic.

3 (4) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the  
4 Pensions Reform Act, the compulsory retirement age of staff of Polytechnic  
5 shall be sixty-five (65) years.

Establishment  
of the Academic  
Board

6 **15.**-(1) There shall be established for the Polytechnic a Board to be  
7 known as the Academic Board which shall consist of the following members:

8 (a) the Rector of the Polytechnic, as the Chairman;

9 (b) the Deputy Rector(s) of the Polytechnic;

10 (c) all Heads of academic Departments and units;

11 (d) the Polytechnic Librarian;

12 (e) not more than two members of the academic staff who are not  
13 members of the Academic Board and not below the rank of Senior Lecturer  
14 elected from among its members, such members shall serve for non-renewable  
15 term of three (3) years;

16 (f) all Deans and Academic Directors; and

17 (g) all Chief Lecturers.

18 (2) The Academic Board shall be responsible for:

19 (a) the direction and management of academic matters of the  
20 Polytechnic including the regulation of admission of students, the award of  
21 certificates and diplomas, scholarships, prizes and other academic distinctions;

22 (b) the making to the Council of such periodic reports on such  
23 academic matters as the Academic Board may think fit or as the Council may  
24 from time to time direct; and

25 (c) the discharge of any other functions which the Council may  
26 delegate to it.

27 *Tenure of Office*

Removal from  
office of members  
of the Council  
and the Rector

28 **16.**-(1) Where it appears to the Governing Council that a member of  
29 the Council other than an ex-officio member or the Rector should be removed  
30 from office on the ground of misconduct or inability to perform the functions of

1 his office, the Council shall make a recommendation through the Minister to  
2 the Federal Executive Council approves of it, the Minister shall declare the  
3 office of such member or Rector vacant.

4 (2) The Minister may recommend the removal of any member of  
5 the Governing Council or Rector to the Federal Executive Council, if he is  
6 satisfied that it is not in the interest of the Public or of the Polytechnic that  
7 such a person should continue as a member of the Council.

8 (3) In case of vacancy in the office of the Rector, the Council shall  
9 appoint an Acting Rector who shall not be in office for more than 6 months.

10 (4) There shall be no sole administration in any Polytechnic in  
11 Nigeria.

12 17.-(1) If it appears to the Council that there are reasons for  
13 believing that any person employed as a member of the academic,  
14 administrative or technical staff of the polytechnic, other than the Rector,  
15 should be removed from office on the ground of misconduct or inability to  
16 perform the functions of his office, the Council shall:

Removal and  
discipline of  
Academic,  
Administrative  
and Technical  
Staff

17 (a) give notice of those reasons to the person in question;

18 (b) afford him an opportunity of making representations in person  
19 on the matter to the Council; and

20 (c) if he or any three members of the Council so request within the  
21 period of one month beginning with the date of the notice, make  
22 arrangements:

23 (i) if he is an academic staff, for a Joint Committee of the Council  
24 and the Academic Board to investigate the matter and to report on it to the  
25 Council;

26 (ii) for a Committee of the Council to investigate the matter, where  
27 it relates to any other member of the staff of the Polytechnic and to report on  
28 it to the Council; and

29 (iii) for the person in question to be afforded an opportunity of  
30 appearing before and being heard by the Investigating Committee with

1 respect to the matter, and if the Council, after considering the report of the  
2 Investigating Committee, is satisfied that the person in question should be  
3 removed as aforesaid, the Council may so remove him by an instrument in  
4 writing signed on the directions of the Council.

5 (2) The Rector may, in a case of misconduct by a member of the staff  
6 which in the opinion of the Rector is prejudicial to the interests of the  
7 Polytechnic, suspend such member and any such suspension shall forthwith be  
8 reported to the Council.

9 (3) For good cause, any member of staff may be suspended from  
10 office or his appointment may be terminated by the Council and for the purpose  
11 of this subsection, "good cause" means:

12 (a) any physical or mental incapacity which the Council, after  
13 obtaining medical advice, considers to be such as to render the person  
14 concerned unfit for the discharge of the functions of his office;

15 (b) any physical or mental incapacity which the Council, after  
16 medical advice, considers to be such as to render the person concerned unfit to  
17 continue to hold his office;

18 (c) conduct of a scandalous or other disgraceful nature which the  
19 Council considers to be such as to render the person concerned unfit to continue  
20 to hold his office;

21 (d) conduct which the Council considers to be such as to constitute  
22 failure or inability of the person concerned to discharge the functions of his  
23 office or to comply with the terms and conditions of his service.

24 (4) Any person suspended pursuant to subsection (2) or (3) of this  
25 section, shall be placed on half pay and the Council shall before the expiration  
26 of the period of three months after the date of such suspension consider the case  
27 against that person and come to a decision as to:

28 (a) whether to continue such person's suspension and if so on what  
29 terms (including the proportion of emoluments to be paid to him);

30 (b) whether to reinstate such person, in which case the Council shall

1 restore his full emoluments to him with effect from the date of suspension;

2 (c) whether to terminate the appointment of the person in question,  
3 in which case such a person, will not be entitled to the proportion of his  
4 emoluments withheld during the period of suspension;

5 (d) whether to take such lesser disciplinary action against such  
6 person (including the restoration of such proportion of his emoluments that  
7 might have been withheld) as the Council may determine, and in any case  
8 where the Council, pursuant to this section, decides to continue a person's  
9 suspension or decides to take further disciplinary action against a person, the  
10 Council shall before the expiration of a period of three months from such  
11 decision come to a final determination in respect of the case concerning any  
12 such person.

13 (5) It shall be the duty of the person by whom an instrument of  
14 removal is signed in pursuance of subsection (1) of this section, to use his  
15 best endeavours to cause a copy of the instrument to be served as soon as  
16 reasonably practicable on the person to whom it relates.

17 (6) Nothing in the foregoing provisions of this section shall prevent  
18 the Council from making such regulations for the discipline of other  
19 categories of staff and workers of the Polytechnic as it may think fit.

20 **18.-(1)** Subject to the provisions of this section, where it appears to  
21 the Rector that any student of the Polytechnic has been guilty of misconduct,  
22 the Rector may, without prejudice to any other disciplinary powers  
23 conferred on him by this Act or regulations made hereunder direct:

Discipline of  
students

24 (a) that the student shall not during such period as may be specified  
25 in the direction, participate in such activities of the Polytechnic, or make use  
26 of such facilities of the Polytechnic, as he may specify;

27 (b) that the activities of the student shall, during such period as may  
28 be specified in the directions, be restricted in such manner as may be so  
29 specified;

30 (c) that the student be suspended for such period as may be

1 specified in the directions; and

2 (d) that the student be expelled from the Polytechnic.

3 (2) Where there is temporarily no Rector or where the Rector refuses  
4 to apply any disciplinary measures, the Council, either directly or through  
5 some other staff, may apply such disciplinary actions as are specified in  
6 subsection (1) of this section to any student of the Polytechnic who is guilty of  
7 misconduct.

8 (3) Where a direction is given under subsection (1)(c) or (d) of this  
9 section in respect of any student, the student may, within a period of 21 days  
10 from the date of the letter communicating the decision to him, appeal from the  
11 direction to the Council; and where such an appeal is brought, the Council  
12 shall, after causing such inquiry to be made into the matter as the Council  
13 considers just, either confirm or set aside the direction or modify it in such  
14 manner as the Council may think fit.

15 (4) The fact that an appeal from a direction is brought in pursuance of  
16 subsection (3) of this section shall not affect the operation of the direction while  
17 the appeal is pending.

18 (5) The Rector may delegate his power under this section to a  
19 Disciplinary Committee consisting of such members of the Polytechnic as he  
20 may nominate.

21 (6) Nothing in this section shall be construed as preventing the  
22 restriction or termination of a student's activities at the Polytechnic otherwise  
23 than on the ground of misconduct.

24 (7) It is hereby declared that a direction under subsection (1)(a) of this  
25 section may be combined with a direction under subsection (1)(b) of this  
26 section.

27 (8) In all cases under this section, the decision of the Council shall be  
28 final.

Discipline of  
Junior Staff

29 **19.**-(1) If any junior staff is accused of misconduct or inefficiency, the  
30 Rector may suspend him for not more than three months and shall forthwith

1 direct the Junior Staff Appointments and Promotions Committee:

2 (a) to consider the case; and

3 (b) to make recommendations as to the appropriate action to be  
4 taken by the Rector.

5 (2) In all cases under this section, the officer shall be informed of  
6 the charge against him and shall be given reasonable opportunity to defend  
7 himself.

8 (3) The Rector may, after considering the recommendation made  
9 pursuant to subsection (1)(b) of this section, dismiss, terminate, retire or  
10 down-grade the officer concerned.

11 (4) Any person aggrieved by the Rector's decision under  
12 subsection (3) of this section, may within a period of 21 days from the date of  
13 the letter communicating the decision to him, address a petition to the  
14 Council to consider his case and the Council's decision thereon shall be  
15 final.

16 (5) In any case of gross misconduct on the part of a junior staff, the  
17 Rector shall forthwith suspend him and thereafter refer the matter to the  
18 Junior Staff Appointments and Promotions Committee to be dealt with  
19 according to the foregoing provisions of this section.

20 **20.**-(1) The Council shall keep proper accounts and proper records  
21 in relation thereto and shall cause to be prepared, not later than 1st October in  
22 each financial year, an estimate of its revenue and expenditure for the  
23 ensuing financial year and when prepared, the estimate shall be submitted to  
24 the National Board for Technical Education for approval.

Audit of Accounts

25 (2) At the end of each financial year but not later than 30th June the  
26 Council shall cause to be prepared a statement of its income and expenditure  
27 during the previous financial year.

28 (3) The statement of accounts referred to in subsection (2) of this  
29 section shall, when certified by the Rector, be audited by a firm of auditors  
30 appointed from the list and in accordance with the guidelines supplied by the

	1	Auditor General of the Federation and shall be published in the annual report of
	2	the Polytechnic.
Funds of the Council	3	<b>21.</b> The funds of the Council shall include-
	4	(a) fees charged by and payable to the Council in respect of students;
	5	(b) any other amounts due to or recoverable by the Council;
	6	(c) revenue from time to time accruing to the Council from the
	7	Federal Government by way of subvention, grant-in-aid, endowment or
	8	otherwise howsoever; and
	9	(d) donations and legacies accruing to the Council from any source
	10	for the special purpose of the Council.
Donations for particular purposes	11	<b>22.</b> -(1) Donations of money to be applied to any particular purpose
	12	shall be placed to the credit of a special reserve account approved by the
	13	Council until such time as they may be expended in fulfillment of such
	14	purpose.

16 *Terms of office of members*

17 1.-(1) A member of the Council other than an ex-officio member shall  
18 hold office for a period of three years beginning with the date on which he was  
19 appointed and shall be eligible for re-appointment for a further term of three  
20 years and thereafter he shall no longer be eligible for re-appointment.

21 (2) Members of the Council holding office as specified in paragraph  
22 1(1) of this Schedule, shall be paid remuneration or allowance in accordance  
23 with rates specified from time to time by the National Council of Ministers.

24 (3) A member of the Council holding office as specified in paragraph  
25 1(1) of this Schedule may by notice in writing to the Minister resign his office.

26 2.-(1) Where a vacancy occurs in the membership of the Council, that  
27 vacancy shall be filled by the appointment of a successor to hold office for the  
28 remainder of the term of office of his predecessor, so however that the  
29 successor shall represent the same interest as his predecessor.

30 (2) The Council may act notwithstanding any vacancy in its

1 membership or the absence of any member or that a person not entitled to do  
2 so took part in its proceedings.

3 *Committees*

4 3.-(1) The Council may appoint one or more committees to which it

22 (ii) one member of the Council;

26 (d) two representatives of the Students Union of the Polytechnic;  
27 and a committee on students affairs shall be charged with the duty of:

28 (i) considering any matter which relates to the welfare of students;

29 (ii) any other matter referred to it by either the Council or  
30 management of the Polytechnic;

1 (iii) any matter which the students wish to refer to the Council shall be  
2 referred to the management in the first instance which may in turn refer the  
3 matter to the Committee on Students' Affairs.

4 (3) No decision of a Committee of the Council shall have effect unless  
5 it is confirmed by the Council.

6 *Proceedings of the Council*

7 4.-(1) The Council shall meet for the conduct of business once in a  
8 quarter except for emergency.

9 (2) The Chairman of the Council may at any time and shall at the  
10 request in writing of not less than five members of the Council summon a  
11 meeting of the Council.

12 (3) Particulars of the business to be transacted shall be circulated to  
13 members with the notice of the meeting at least two weeks before the date of the  
14 meeting.

15 5. Where the Council desires to obtain the advice of any person on any  
16 particular matter, it may co-opt such person as a member for a meeting whether  
17 or not expressly convened for the purpose of considering the particular matter  
18 but no co-opted member shall be entitled to vote or shall count towards  
19 quorum.

20 6. -(1) Every question put before the Council at a meeting shall be  
21 decided by a simple majority of the members present and voting.

22 (2) Two third of members shall form a quorum at any meeting of the

9 (ii) the Rector shall be the Chairman of the Management

11 (iii) the Management Committee shall meet at least once in a  
12 month to discuss and take decisions on matters of general interest to the

14 (b) (i) There shall be a School Board for each school in the  
15 Polytechnic made up of all the Academic Staff in that School;

16 (ii) The School Board deal with academic matters and any other  
17 matter of interest to the School or any matter assigned to it by the Council,

19 (iii) The Dean shall be the Chairman of the School Board;

20 (iv) The Dean shall be elected from among the Academic Staff not  
21 below the rank of Chief Lecturer in that School for a tenure of three years  
22 and not immediately renewable.

23 (c) (i) There shall be a Departmental Board for each Department in  
24 the Polytechnic made up of all the Academic Staff in that department;

25 (ii) The Departmental Board shall deal with academic matters and  
26 any other matter of interest to the Department;

27 (iii) The Head of Department shall be chairman of the  
28 Departmental Board;

29 (iv) The Head of Department shall be elected from among the  
30 Academic staff not below the rank of Senior Lecturer in that department for

1 a tenure of three years and not immediately renewable.

2 (d) Where there is no qualified candidate for the position of Dean or  
3 Head of Department, the Rector shall appoint an Acting Dean not below the  
4 rank of Senior Lecturer or Acting Head of Department not below the rank of  
5 Lecturer I for a period of one year in the first instance and renewable once and  
6 no more;

7 (e) Nothing in this Act shall prevent the Management Committee and  
8 Boards from making supplementary rules to guide their proceedings provided  
9 such rules are not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act.

10 *Establishment of the Congregation*

11 10.-(a) There shall be for the Polytechnic, a Congregation made of  
12 both Academic and Senior Non-Teaching staff, who holds at least a first degree  
13 or its equivalent;

14 (b) The Rector shall be the Chairman of the Congregation;

15 (c) The Congregation shall meet at least once in a year.

16 11. Any contract or instrument which if entered into by a person not  
17 being a body corporate would not be required to be under seal, may in like  
18 manner be entered into or executed on behalf of the Council by any person  
19 generally or specifically authorized by it for that purpose.

20 12.-(1) The common seal of the Council shall not be used or affixed to  
21 any document except in pursuance of a resolution duly passed at a properly  
22 constituted meeting of the Council and recorded in the minutes of such  
23 meeting.

24 (2) The fixing of the seal of the Council shall be authenticated by the  
25 signature of the Chairman of the Council and some other member authorized  
26 generally or specifically by the Council to act for that purpose.

27 (3) Any document purporting to be a document duly executed under  
28 the seal of the Council shall be received in evidence and shall, unless the  
29 contrary is proved, be deemed to be so executed.

30 13. Any member of the Council or a committee thereof who has a
