ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows: PART I - PRELIMINARY PROVISIONS 1. EXPLANATORY NOTE

This Bill seeks to provide a comprehensive legal framework for effective management of the inauguration and swearing-in of elected or in-coming members of the National Assembly after the dissolution of the out-going National Assembly by the President pursuant to Section 64(3) of the Constitution and for this purpose an ad hoc committee known as the "National Assembly Inauguration Committee" is established under this Bill for effective and efficient coordination. Amongst issues covered in the Bill, the First Tuesday immediately following the dissolution of the out-going National Assembly and the inauguration and swearing-in of the person elected as President is also stipulated as the day for inauguration of incoming National Assembly.
